

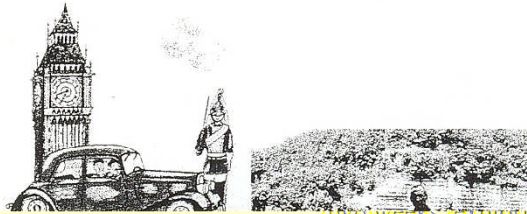

RALLY « PERTRAC ROSES »

On the trace of the English cousins of the French Citroën Traction-Avant

Pertrac Découvertes (registered charter) is the embodiment of Citroën Traction-Avant Owner Rallies whose aim is to explore different countries and to meet people of varying cultures whilst at the same time, on a non-profit basis, raising money for numerous charities. Successful rallies have already taken place in former years, "Pertrac Tulipe" in the Netherlands in 2004 and "Pertrac Palmier" in Morocco in 2006. A third rally, named "Pertrac Roses" is being organised to take place in the South East of England in June 2008. England have been chosen, because of the attachment of many Englishmen to the French Périgord, region where the (Dutch) organiser lives and the successive Pertrac rallies have been planned. The city of Bergerac have kindly agreed to sponsor our rally.

The rally will start at Bergerac in the Périgord region of France on June 2nd and after traveling north through France, will arrive in Great Britain via the Euro Tunnel. As with previous rallies, teams of French, Swiss, English and Dutch nationalities will be visiting the counties of Kent, Sussex, Surrey and Hampshire during a period of two weeks: exploring the heritage of southern

highlights as well as the moment to commemorate the 64th anniversary of D-day by visiting the Battle of Britain memorial at Capel-le-Ferne, close to Folkstone.



The Pertrac charter obliges each team member to participate actively in the organisation of the rally and to be responsible for a specific task. In addition, all members are committed to respect cultures, religion, way of life and traditions of the countries that are visited. Sponsoring is accepted in accordance with the ethic of the charter.

The charity program of the "Pertrac Roses" rally is the fundraising for a dedicated area for children to be treated for cancer at Winchester's Royal Hospital. "Sophie's Place", as the area is named, refers to Sophie Barringer who died at the age of six because of a rare form of kidney cancer. The work on "Sophie's Place" has already begun but fundamental to its success is the need for funding to complete the project. For this reason the participants of the "Pertrac Roses" rally have committed themselves to collect donations for "Sophie's Place" and try, in a way, to bring a little bit of Périgord sunshine to the hospitalised children. During the rally, the money donated will be officially handed over to the representatives of the Trust at "Sophie's Place" in Winchester on Tuesday, June 10th 2008.
